Sri Shekhar Prasad Singh, popularly known as S.P.Singh, is a 1983 batch IAS Officer. He was born in 1958 in Dumka in the then Bihar State – presently Jharkhand. His father is a renowned freedom fighter and was a senior civil servant.

Sri S.P.Singh worked as a Lecturer in Delhi University before joining the Indian Administrative Service.
